We had a well attended and successful Annual General Meeting, with councillor Sue Wells as our guest speaker.

Sue's talk was very lively and motivating. Taking the ideas behind "Neighbourhood Week" as a point of departure, she focussed on such things as the importance of forming mutually supportive links with neighbours (a theme that appears elsewhere in this issue too), dialogue between residents and councillors, Community Board members and Council staff, the need for both residents and elected representatives to be vigilant and critical in the face of proposals that emanate from the Council bureaucracy. If you've got a problem, she urged, get onto your local councillors about it. Remember, they normally want to get re-elected. This led to a vigorous discussion of a number of local issues, and gave committee members much food for thought.

We had planned to hold a public meeting to promote the formation of some new Neighbourhood Support Groups. That plan has had to be deferred until next year. Watch our first issue in 2001 for an announcement.

In the meantime, with the festive season drawing nearer, we urge everyone to be that extra bit vigilant and watchful and give thieves a really hard time. Make sure your home is as secure as possible, especially when you are away from it.

Be on the lookout for strangers, for people behaving suspiciously. Arrange with your neighbours to keep an eye on each other's properties. Include such arrangements in your holiday planning

Have a safe, happy, healthy, Christmas and New Year, free from the misery of break-ins, burglary and theft.

What sort of emergencies can we expect?

Earthquakes; Floods; Storms; Tsunami (would effect the coastal areas); Fire; Electricity black-outs.

How can I be prepared?

Have a basic kit of Survival items: clean water and food for up to 3 days; medications; food for pets; a radio with spare batteries; a torch with spare batteries...

Read the back pages of your yellow pages telephone book

Who can help me or my neighbours?

Your Civil Defence Sector Post will open to help those who need shelter, food and/or medical assistance.

What can I do to help?

Join your Civil Defence team

Put your name on the resources register for your sector (to help the team during an emergency); we may need doctors; nurses; translators; child carers; counsellors; receptionists; carpenters; builders, mechanics, to name a few...

Offer the use of goods and machinery, e.g. blankets; sleeping bags; chainsaws; 4W drive vehicles; block and tackle; water containers;

Get to know your neighbours; activate your Neighbourhood Support Group; keep an eye on potential problems, e.g. large trees, the river banks, road and cliff faces on the hill:

Kowhai Arboretum Planting, Beckenham Park, 30 September 2000





Hello again from everyone at the Clinic. As summer and the holiday season get under way, please remember to consider your pets' needs. Every year we see sad cases where pets have been left to fend for themselves while their owners are away on holiday. Catteries and kennels will be full over this time, so make your bookings or other care arrangements early.

Remember too that vaccinations need to be up to date, and that the protection takes 10—14 days to build up—so it's important to get these done well before animals go for boarding.

With the warmer weather, fleas are now in full force and we are seeing lots of itchy pets, some with severe irritations. Prevention is always the best way; so take advantage of some professional advice when choosing from the ever-growing range of treatments available.
